METHODOLOGY

The survey was conducted with 1,659 Canadian residents aged 18 and over from October 29th to November 2nd, 2020. A random sample of panelists were invited to complete the survey from a set of partner panels based on the Lucid exchange platform. These partners are typically double opt-in survey panels, blended to manage out potential skews in the data from a single source.

The margin of error for a comparable probability-based random sample of the same size is +/- 2.4%, 19 times out of 20.

The data were weighted according to census data to ensure that the sample matched Canada's population according to age, gender, educational attainment, and region. Totals may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- Since June, concerns regarding infectious disease remain consistent and top of mind. Concerns about gender inequality around the world have seen a decline.
- Canadian's continue to be less supportive of more general aid (through ODA) but highly supportive of Canadian involvement in specific issues, like women and children's health, and specific actions, like vaccinating healthcare workers in poorer countries.
 - As infectious diseases and COVID-19 remain top of mind framing aid around the spread of the virus will be effective (such as a self-interested outbreak framework), but as we start discussing more specific solutions, the is broad support for vaccinating healthcare workers worldwide, including anecdotal support for the concept, and support for Canada providing financial assistance.
- More than 70% of Canadians support the government investing to help ensure healthcare workers everywhere in the world get access to a COVID-19 vaccine.

GLOBAL ISSUES

- Infectious disease continues to be a top concern for Canadians, as do the issues of poverty and climate change.
- Just over half of Canadians are concerned about the global issue of gender inequality (57%). This has decreased from 67% in June.
 - Women are more concerned than men about both the spread of infectious diseases and gender inequality.
 - Older Canadians are more concerned about the spread of infectious disease, while younger Canadians are more concerned about gender inequality.
 - Of the three main parties, NDP voters, and Liberal voters are most concerned and equally concerned about gender inequality.
 - Women are also more concerned about the health and rights of women and children, compared to men. As are younger Canadians compared to older Canadians.




TOP GLOBAL CONCERNS OVER TIME




CANADA'S ROLE

- Nearly all Canadians still support Canada having a role in improving the health and rights of women and children around the world.
 - Support is more tempered than in June when concerns about the pandemic were at their lowest levels since the start of it. We see a slight shift from being a leader (now 46%) to 'doing it's fair share' (now 45%).
 - Support is still strongest among: women, those 18-29, those living in Ontario and Atlantic Canada (and now Quebec), and NDP/GPC voters.
- Two thirds still support Canada investing in the health of people living in poorer countries, with support still strongest among young Canadians (those 18-29).
- A majority of Canadians would be satisfied with \$50 or \$100 million in government support for vaccinating healthcare workers in poorer countries. This includes around 15% who would be 'thrilled with either amount'.
 - Enthusiastic support is strongest among young Canadians (in particular the \$100 million), and among the three main parties, highest among Liberal and NDP voters.














- There is a growing understanding of the importance of global solutions for the pandemic. 79% say that 'unless COVID is controlled in all parts of the world, we can't return to normal life in Canada' (an increase of 6 pts since June)
- There is also a strong level of support (three-quarters of Canadians) for vaccinating healthcare workers around the world. Adding a caveat of 'after Canadians have received sufficient access' does little to sway support- in fact, Liberal voters are most likely to support an argument without the caveat.




Do you agree or disagree with the following statements?




SUPPORT FOR VACCINATION OF HEALTHCARE WORKERS ABROAD [SPLIT SAMPLE DESIGN]








A variety of factors effect the efficacy of frames (like age, personally important issues, voting preferences, and perceptions of the COVID pandemic).

ON ISSUES	 For those who cared about a particular issue (the spread of infectious disease, gender inequality), framing around CANADA'S ROLE and VACCINATING HEALTHCARE WORKERS are more compelling, compared to the average Canadian.
ON GENERATIONS	 Those 18-29 are much more convinced about the CANADA'S ROLE frame than any other age group, while older Canadians seem to slightly favour the SELF-INTERESTED: OUTBREAK and VACCINATING HEALTHCARE WORKERS framework.
ON POLITICS	 LPC voters are more supportive of the VACCINATING HEALTHCARE WORKERS framework than voters of all other parties. They are highly supportive of the CANADA'S ROLE framework, and the SELF-INTERESTED-OUTBREAK framework. LPC voters are most aligned with NDP voters on the CANADA's ROLE framework.
ON COVID	 Those who are worried about COVID are more in favour of the CANADA'S ROLE framework, compared to those who are not. And also more in favour of the SELF-INTERESTED: OUTBREAK framework, which has changed since June. Those who are worried about COVID are much likely to support the VACCINATING HEALTHCARE WORKERS, compared to those who are not concerned about the virus.
AMONG WOMEN	 Younger women are much more likely to support an argument for CANADA'S ROLE, than older women. While older women are more likely to favour the VACCINATING HEALTHCARE WORKERS framework. The SELF-INTERESTED: OUTBREAK framework is equally appealing

All things considered, a framework that highlights Canada's role in assisting with specific groups/issues, and now, the importance of vaccinations for healthcare workers, is likely the best approach.



 - Those most likely to be familiar with the organization are: 30-44, live in Ontario, voted LPC, and men (though only slightly)




AWARENESS OF ORGANIZATIONS


